

INTRODUCTION

GSMA Ltd., located at 165 Ottley Drive, Suite 150, Atlanta, Georgia 30324, United States of America (the “**GSMA**”), organizes Mobile World Congress (the “**Event**”), held in Barcelona from 25th to 28th February 2019. GSMA is proud to present the Mobile World Scholar Challenge at Mobile World Congress 2019 Barcelona (“**MWCB19**”). All submissions are subject to these terms and conditions (the “**Challenge Official Rules**”).

THE MOBILE WORLD SCHOLAR CHALLENGE

The Mobile World Scholar Challenge (the “**Challenge**”) is a global pitching competition targeted to universities and researchers eager to create innovative products and services that will revolutionize and disrupt the mobile tech industry.

Embracing new ideas is the key to innovation and growth, be it an economy, an industry, a company, charity or person. At Mobile World Congress (“**MWC**”), the largest and most important gathering of the mobile industry in the world, the GSMA is constantly on the lookout to showcase the best and brightest ideas impacting our mobile world.

The GSMA created the Mobile World Scholar program to connect the great minds and ideas of tomorrow with the mobile industry. The GSMA desires to feature new and impactful ideas and concepts from the academic and research communities around the world at MWC. The GSMA requests submissions of videos of **no longer than** three (3) minutes in duration which highlight both “the science” and the potential “use case” for your research. The more applicability to mobile, the better.

We seek submissions with significant application(s) in the mobile industry, such as:

- Artificial intelligence / machine learning / deep learning applications
- Blockchain
- Digital twin
- Hybrid opto-electro mechanical devices @ nano scale
- Mapping, such as indoor micro locations
- Materials science, with applications in battery technology, screens, sensors, chip enhancement, devices, antennas/masts, or other areas
- Network efficiency, such as innovations to reduce the cost of running network or initiatives to promote low cost connectivity (including Low Earth Orbit Satellites)
- Neuromorphic engineering, brain computer interface, or the human brain project
- Optimized content delivery
- Quantum computing
- Radio spectrum, such as more efficient usage opportunities
- Security and data protection
- Smart city new use cases
- Volumetric displays
- Other – If you have other topics that you believe have significant innovative use cases, we will consider as well. Please feel free to submit but clearly state what Innovation Area it represents.

HOW TO JOIN THE CHALLENGE

To enter the Challenge, eligible applicants must provide accurate information to MWScholar@gsma.com according to the requirements described at the Challenge website, www.mwcbarcelona.com/experiences/next-gen-innovation/mobile-world-scholar-challenge/ (the “**Website**”), in compliance with these Challenge Official Rules and according to the instructions set forth in the Website. Any individual or team of individuals which submits information or a Project in connection with the Challenge is an applicant (each, an “**Applicant**”). All terms contained herein which reference the Applicant continue to apply should the Applicant meet the criteria and be selected to become a Finalist (defined below). All materials submitted by Applicant to the GSMA in relation to the Challenge constitute the project (“**Project**”).

Submission of information on the Website constitutes Applicant’s full and unconditional agreement to these Challenge Official Rules and decisions of the GSMA, which are final and binding in all matters related to the Challenge. Becoming a Finalist is contingent upon Applicant fulfilling all requirements set forth in these Challenge Official Rules.

Once the Project is received, the GSMA will verify that the entry was received in compliance with the Challenge Official Rules, and may at its discretion ask for modification or additional information from the Applicant. The GSMA will review all validly submitted entries and submit to the jury, which will make a final determination of the finalists (each, a “**Finalist**” or together, the “**Finalists**”), the number of which is at GSMA’s sole discretion. Each finalist will be designated a “Mobile World Scholar” and will be invited to attend MWCB19. Should an Applicant be a team, all team members may be named Mobile World Scholars, but only one individual from each Finalist Winning submission may be selected by the Applicant of record to attend MWCB19. A Grand Prize winner will be chosen from the Finalists.

ELIGIBILITY

The Challenge is open to individuals who are at least eighteen (18) years of age on the date of entry, or teams of individuals all of whom are at least eighteen (18) years of age on the date of entry. To be eligible to win the prize to attend MWCB19, an individual must hold all documentation and meet all requirements to travel to Spain from 24 – 28 February 2019. The Challenge is subject to all applicable federal, state and local laws. The GSMA is subject to the laws of the United States of America, the United Kingdom, and the European Union, and therefore must comply with trade sanctions administered or enforced by the U.S. Department of the Treasury’s Office of Foreign Assets Control (“**OFAC**”), the U.S. Department of State, the United Nations Security Council, the European Union, Her Majesty’s Treasury, or other relevant sanctions authority (collectively, the “**Authorities**”). To be eligible, the Applicant must not be subject to any restrictions or prohibitions of the Authorities.

Employees of GSMA, and their parent and affiliate companies as well as the immediate family (spouse, parents, siblings and children) and household members of each such employee are not eligible to enter the Challenge. Submission of a Project constitutes Applicant’s (and all members of an Applicant team) full and unconditional agreement to these Challenge Official Rules and decisions of the GSMA, which are final and binding in all matters related to the Challenge. Winning a prize is contingent upon fulfilling all requirements set forth in these Challenge Official Rules. Prizes are not redeemable for cash if for any reason a portion of the prize cannot be awarded to a Finalist.

SELECTION OF PROJECTS

Finalists will be selected by the jury members. The jury will proceed to select the Finalists among all Projects validly registered in the Challenge, according but not limited to the following criteria:

- Innovation: extent, uniqueness, proprietary rights and centrality of the project
- Clarity and accessibility
- Social impact
- Uniqueness of approach
- Relevance to the telecommunications industry and all vertical industries
- Scalability and potential for expansion
- Serious technology with sustainable competitive advantages preferred, but not required
- A high innovation component, understanding innovation in the broad sense (product, process, business plan, etc.)

Only Projects received in English will be eligible. A high-level of English language skills are required as the Challenge will be judged solely on the English language content submitted. As an example, if the video submission is in a language other than English, it must be augmented with English captions to be considered.

CALENDAR

Registration period

The Challenge will begin at 12:00 AM GMT on 3 December 2018 and end at 11:59 PM GMT on 20 January 2019 (the “**Registration Period**”). Projects received outside the Registration Period will not be admitted.

The GSMA reserves the right to extend the application process or Registration Period. Any change will be posted on the Website and communicated to Applicants.

Selection process

Following the close of the Registration Period, the jury members will analyze each Project and select each Mobile World Scholar Finalist. The jury members will also select the Grand Prize winning entry from among the Finalists.

Finalist notification and announcement

The Finalists will be announced on or around 12 February 2019 on the Website. Prior to that, the GSMA will contact the prospective finalists privately through the e-mail address provided on the entry form to inform them of their prospective selection within ten (10) days of end of Registration Period. Within 48 hours of notice, the prospective finalist must complete the requirements provided by the organizer, which may include but is not limited to (i) execution of an Affidavit of Eligibility; (ii) execution of a Release of Liability; (iii) execution of a Publicity Release; (iv) any relevant tax forms; and (v) other documentation as required by the GSMA.

If a prospective finalist cannot be contacted within the specified time, fails to respond within the specified time of two (2) days, fails to sign and return the required documentation, or has not properly completed the items required for entry, the prospective finalist forfeits all rights in and to the prize and the GSMA shall be entitled to select an alternative Applicant as a prospective finalist. Acceptance as a Finalist and receiving a prize are contingent upon compliance with these Challenge Official Rules and execution of the required documentation.

PRIZES

If selected as a Finalist, you will be eligible for the following prize packages depending on your selection level.

- Airfare and accommodation* to attend MWCB19, including an MWCB19 Gold Pass** (retail value €2,699***);
- A £1,500 "Mobile World Scholar Finalist Award"****, paid by Mastercard Gift Card in Great Britain Pounds Sterling by 29 March 2019
- Finalist videos will be shown on-site at MWCB19 on video screens and on our in-house broadcast channel (Mobile World Live), subject to the execution of a license to GSMA for use of the video

Grand Prize

There will be one Grand Prize Winner selected from the Finalists. The Grand Prize Winner will enjoy the Finalist benefits listed above, and in addition:

- Designation as the "Mobile World Scholar Grand Prize Winner 2019"
- a £10,000 "Mobile World Scholar Grand Prize Award"****, Mastercard Gift Card in Great Britain Pounds Sterling by 29 March 2019

The estimated total retail value of the prize packages cannot be calculated due to the nature of the opportunities provided which are difficult to quantify and the question of availability. The value of each prize will exceed the cash value of the award: Finalist, £1,500; Grand Prize, £10,000.

Any Finalist who cannot attend MWCB19 will forfeit the airfare, accommodations, and Gold Pass to MWCB19, but will still receive the £1,500 Award.

If a prospective finalist or Finalist rejects a prize, no alternative will be offered. Each prize is personal and not transferable. The sale or marketing of prizes is prohibited.

Without limiting in any way the consumer rights recognized by any applicable regulations, GSMA is not liable for the negligent or illegal use of any prize by a Finalist.

PARTICIPATION DETAILS

Submitted Projects must be the original work of the Applicant and must be entered by either an individual of legal age or a team, with no size restriction, provided each member is of legal age. The identity of each individual must be capable of verification through official documents (ID, passport, driving license, business documents, etc.) which will be provided to the GSMA immediately on request.

Without limiting in any way the consumer rights recognized by any applicable regulations, the GSMA is not responsible for the loss or delay of an attempted Project submission due to any interruption, temporary lack of availability or continuity in operation, transmission problem, loss of information, fraud, network error, software malfunction, access, or communication or response error. The GSMA is not responsible for the loss, delay, or change due to technical problems or problems of any other nature not attributable to us, beyond our control or attributable to network operators, providers of intermediary services, postal or message services, or third parties. The GSMA shall be exempt from any obligation or compensation to the Applicants or Finalists if for reasons of force majeure or legal imperative that MWC must be cancelled or suspended.

Applicants must have access to the internet as the Challenge can only be accessed online on the Website. Applicants must provide a valid e-mail address. The jury reserves the right to disqualify any Project that, in its sole judgment, violates the letter or the spirit of the Challenge Official Rules, guidelines, processes and rules of the Challenge. The jury members' decisions are final and binding.

No purchase necessary to enter. A purchase will not increase your chances of selection. Void where prohibited.

The GSMA is exempt from all liability, penalty, claim, demand or civil, commercial, criminal, administrative proceedings, including compensation of any kind and/or nature, expenses, costs (expressly including attorneys' fees and solicitors).

The decision of the jury members on the Finalists and Grand Prize Winner is final and the GSMA will not enter into any correspondence about the results. The GSMA accepts no responsibility for submissions which are lost, misdirected, illegible, late, mutilated, altered, or lost for any reason.

CONFIDENTIALITY

Any and all materials submitted, including business plans, must be appropriate for public dissemination. Submissions must not include any confidential information that the Applicant does not wish to make public. Due to the nature of the Challenge, the GSMA is not responsible for the confidentiality of the business plans and their content, or the publication thereof.

DECLARATION AGREEMENT

Each Applicant agrees that he/she/they will:

- Attend MWCB19 if selected as a Finalist*, make a public presentation of their Project if requested by GSMA, and participate in the informal presentations and discussions with interested parties at the designated place if requested by GSMA;
- Provide a local digital copy (not on YouTube or other social media application) of their video submission, and provide a non-exclusive, royalty-free, irrevocable, transferable, worldwide, perpetual license to utilize the video and all materials collected or developed as part of the Challenge and MWC in any medium whatsoever, provided that (save the license described) the intellectual property in the underlying ideas shall remain at all times with the Applicant;
- Follow all of the Challenge Official Rules and instructions of the GSMA, and accept the GSMA's decision; and
- Meet all deadlines at penalty of immediate disqualification.

Any failure to meet deadlines or comply with the procedures expressed in these Challenge Official Rules will disqualify the Applicant from the Challenge. Similarly, any misrepresentation, fraud or infringement of intellectual property or third parties' rights, will result in immediate disqualification and, if applicable, the obligation to return all prizes.

*It is the Finalist's sole responsibility to consult a doctor to assess their fitness to travel. If the Finalist is unfit to travel, the Finalist may designate an alternate to attend and perform the responsibilities in the Finalist's stead. Save the licenses described herein, all intellectual property rights in the Project remain vested in the Applicant.

Applicant hereby grants a non-exclusive, royalty-free, irrevocable, for the maximum period of validity in each territory, transferable, worldwide license to the GSMA to use Applicant's Project, logo, and contact information for any purpose, including without limitation for advertising and promotion of GSMA's activities.

Additionally, by entering, Applicant authorizes the GSMA to:

- (i) capture Applicant's image, voice and/or statements during the Event as well as during any prior or subsequent act which is directly or indirectly related thereto;

- (ii) reproduce and/or fix the above, in whole or in part, on audiovisual, video-graphic, photographic or paper, among other forms;
- (iii) use for promotional purposes the image (including the voice and name) and the Project of the Applicant, through any method or medium that the GSMA deems appropriate (including, by way of illustration and not limitation, brochures, newspapers, magazines, books, and Internet), all without geographical or temporary limitation.

By entering the Challenge, Applicant represents and warrants that the Applicant holds all right, title and interest in the Project, that the information contained is accurate and complete, and that by submitting the Project to the GSMA, Applicant is not and will not be violating any contract or third party rights including but not limited to any patents, copyrights, trade secrets, proprietary or confidential information, trademarks, or rights to privacy including personal data. The GSMA shall not be liable for any violation of any rule or third party rights by an Applicant. Applicant will indemnify, defend, and hold the GSMA harmless from all liability for any breach of this paragraph. Should the GSMA discover or suspect that there has been plagiarism, third party rights have been violated or projects entered have not been created by their purported author or authors, the GSMA reserves the right to eliminate the Project, and Applicant, from the Challenge.

DATA PROTECTION

All Applicants' personal data is collected and used by the GSMA for the provision of services in connection with the Challenge in accordance with all applicable Data Protection laws.

GSMA informs Applicants that the personal data provided to GSMA in relation to the Challenge shall be incorporated into a data file managed by GSMA, located at 165 Ottley Drive, Suite 150, Atlanta, GA 30324, United States of America, in order to process the entry in the Challenge.

All personal data processed by the GSMA will be processed in accordance with the policies and practices described in these Challenge Official Rules and in the Mobile World Congress Privacy Policy at <https://www.mwcbarcelona.com/legal/privacy/>. The GSMA reserves the right to update the Privacy Policy when necessary to reflect changes in GSMA products and services. If there are material changes to the policy or in how GSMA will use your personal data, the GSMA will notify you either by prominently posting a notice of such changes before they take effect or by directly sending you a notification. The GSMA encourages you to periodically review the Privacy Policy to learn how the GSMA is protecting your information.

In using your information for the specified purposes, it may be transferred to countries outside the EEA and Switzerland. By way of example, this may happen if one of our associated companies or our service providers is located in a country outside the EEA. Furthermore, by properly submitting a Project on the online platform accessible at the Website, Applicant acknowledges and agrees to publish Applicant's status as an Applicant, if applicable. If Applicant is selected as a prospective finalist, GSMA will use the provided information to contact Applicant and, if applicable, to award the prize(s). GSMA advises Applicants that all the information provided for entry in the Challenge is required, such that if any information is missing, the use of the information for the aforementioned purposes will not be possible, and the entry shall therefore be void. All submitted information will be kept for the time deemed necessary or appropriate to carry out the previously stated purposes.

Finalists – US citizens

All US federal, state, and other taxes, are solely the responsibility of the Finalist.

These documents must be approved by GSMA before the Finalist can claim the prize.

Finalists – non-US citizens

If the Finalist is a non-US citizen, the Finalist will be required to fill out an IRS form W-8BEN.

In that case, GSMA will issue the Finalist an IRS form 1042.

These documents must be approved by GSMA before the Finalist can claim the prize.

GSMA may also deduct withholding taxes on the prize, according to the applicable rates in the tax treaty (if any) between the non-US citizen Finalist's country and the US.

GENERAL

Release: Released Parties are not liable for: (i) failed, returned or misdirected notifications; or (ii) entries and responses to winner notifications which are lost, late, incorrectly completed, incomplete, illegible, unintelligible, misdirected, damaged or otherwise not received by the intended recipient in whole or in part or for any human, computer, or technical error of any kind. Released Parties are not responsible for any computer or network malfunctions which may occur of any kind, whether human, mechanical, or otherwise, relating to or in connection with the Challenge, for any incorrect or inaccurate information, howsoever caused. Nothing in these Challenge Official Rules will exclude any liability which cannot be excluded by law. The maximum liability of GSMA hereunder shall not exceed one hundred Euros (€100).

Choice of Law: The Challenge shall be governed by the State of Georgia, United States of America. By participating in the Challenge, Applicant irrevocably submit to the jurisdiction of the state and federal courts of the state of Georgia, located in Atlanta, and agree that those court shall have personal jurisdiction over any dispute or litigation arising from or relating to the Challenge and that venue for a legal dispute shall only be the state or federal courts of the state of Georgia, located in Atlanta.
